The two most common phishing methods are credential theft, which is when an email is leveraged to conduct a credential harvesting attack on your organization, and malware dropper attacks, when emails deliver malware that can compromise endpoints.

An organization's cybersecurity practices must address these two attack vectors because both attack types leverage email, email systems should be the focus for additional security controls.
