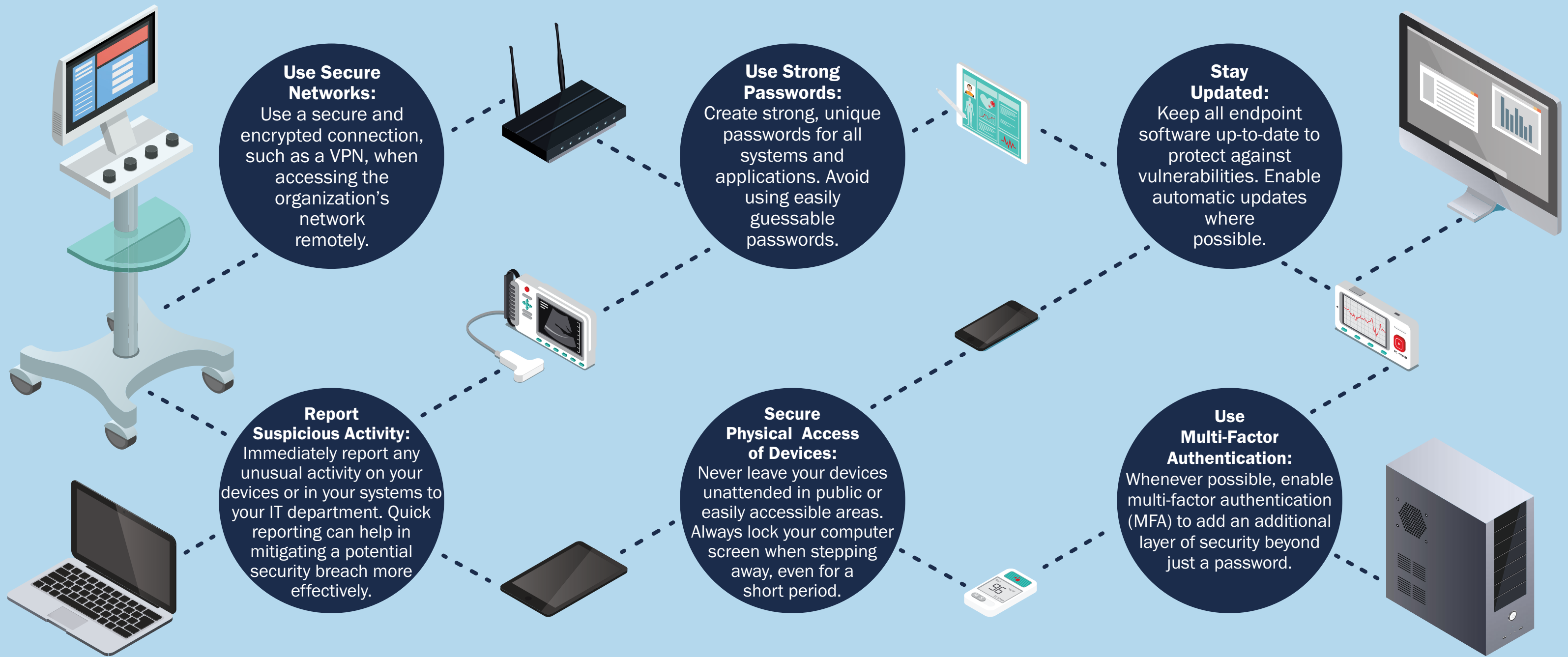


Protect Your Endpoints: A Safeguard for Healthcare
